English & Literacy

Through the context of 'Pirates,' pupil's writing will focus on a variety of genres including personal, imaginative and functional. We will create our own wanted posters for a pirate and write pirate stories. We will aim to include a range of descriptive vocabulary and connectives to create interesting and detailed pieces of writing.

Handwriting will be taught by Mrs Burton once a week and we will continue to apply the spelling rules we have learnt to improve the standard of our writing.

Reading will take place every day and your child will be listened to at least twice a week. We will be focusing on using our Reading skills to locate useful information.

Children will continue to develop their phonological awareness through taking part in Vowel House and Colourful Consonants activities and lessons.

Maths & Numeracy

This term we will begin by learning all about information handling. Pupils will become familiar with different methods of collecting and presenting data using charts.

We will also learn about sharing and combining equal groups of numbers. This will form the basis of children's understanding of multiplication and division.

For our Mental Maths we will be learning how to find numbers halfway between pairs of numbers and using our knowledge of double to work out answers to near doubles sums.



Interdisciplinary Learning: Pirates!

This term our context for learning is Pirates. We will be learning about this context through the curriculum areas of Literacy, Social Studies and Expressive Arts. The key questions we will explore are:

What is a pirate? How did pirates travel? What was life like on board a pirate ship? Who were famous pirates? Why was treasure so important to pirates?
