# Nursery Learning Letter: Term 3

Welcome to Term 3 in Mid Calder Nursery. We had a very busy time in Term 2, looking at different materials and how we could use them to build and using vocabulary such as hard, soft, rough and smooth. We participated in several science experiments, where we investigated how a car would move down a ramp when travelling on different surfaces and we also looked at the changes in ice as it freezes and melts again in changing environments. We loved the excitement in the run up to Christmas and enjoyed sharing this special time with your children. The children enjoyed taking part in a variety of Christmas activities and we hope you agree, performed brilliantly at their Christmas show. This term as part of the school Burns celebrations the children are learning "Wee Willie Winkie" in Scots. ## **Key Learning: Superheroes**

The children have been very excited by our new topic on Superheroes. As well as fictional superheroes, we will be learning about real life heroes. These include the lollipop person, police officers, fire fighters and ambulance crews. We are hoping that we will be able to have a visit or two from our real life superheroes.

The children have been involved in discussion about what makes a superhero and how they could be a nursery super hero, demonstrating the school values. They have taken part in role play, with dressing up and mask making being very popular.

## Consultative Planner - Possible Lines of Development (PLODS)

**Outdoor learning** - Build caves/dens/ shelters for emergency vehicles Add labels to vehicles (ambulance etc) Dress up clothes and tabards outdoor

**Role play** - Initially put out a limited choice of 'hero' outfits – police hat/cape/ nurse/ fire fighter. Monitor and add to this as the topic develops

**House corner** – who are your heroes at home? Superhero Headquarters!

**Small world/ manipulatives** - Betty Spaghetti dolls to create hero characters. Popoid available for character making. People who help us jigsaws

**Craft table** - Make masks, Make wings, Junk emergency vehicles, Finger printing identity cards

**Writing/Mark making** - Opportunities to write stories about the characters they create. Have examples of familiar text linked to signs in the surrounding area (police station, ambulance, hospital)

ICT - Watch clips of heroes in action Use comic life/purple mash to create comic stories using their hero characters

**Other** - Read Superhero stories. (Supertato). Invite visitors in to speak to children. Have a variety of books on display/available to read. Read other People who help us 'books.
