English & Literacy

This term we are going 'back to basics' and revisiting basic grammar. Grammar lessons will link to writing activities and we will continue to use up-levelling techniques to improve the standard of the children's writing.

Through the IDL context of 'Mid Calder Elections' we will be looking at persuasive writing and how this will help when writing a speech and manifesto for their election campaign. This will also involve making leaflets and posters to promote their campaign. We will also be looking at how to summarise a text.

Our reading in term 3, will focus on inference skills, comprehension and word meanings.



Maths & Numeracy

This term, we have gone back to our grouped maths where one of our focuses will be fractions, decimals and percentages. We will be building on the children's prior knowledge. We will continue with number talks and mental maths on a daily basis. The children are becoming much more confident about talking about what strategies they have used.

In whole class maths, pupils will investigate data handling where we will be collecting, organising and presenting data. We have already started this through I.D.L where we gathered information from the Scottish Census and made comparisons to other areas.
