English & Literacy

This term, our writing will link to our IDL context, The Lion King, and will allow the children to explore genres such as reviews, advertising posters, letters of invitation and scripts.

Our reading in term 4 will continue to focus on Higher Order Thinking Skills, identifying the key features of different genres and making connections to other areas of the curriculum. Reading homework will be issued weekly with accompanying tasks. Please be aware that some of the reading homework this term will be set using Purple Mash. Every child has been given a password and username which can be found in their homework jotter.

To develop the children's listening and talking skills, we will be using the context of The Lion King to build on their ability to peer and self-assess, take on feedback and uplevel their performance.

Maths & Numeracy

This term, our numeracy sessions will focus on multiplication and division, fractions, chance and uncertainty and probability. To support this at home, regular revision of the times tables and related division facts would be beneficial. In our wider maths this term, the focus will be on money and shape, position and movement.

In mental agility, the children will be continuing to develop their mathematical strategies through Number Talks. This approach encourages the children to find the most efficient way to reach an answer to a given problem.

We encourage you to log on to www.sumdog.co.uk to practise mental maths and reading skills. Each child has a login and has been set maths and reading skill challenges.

Interdisciplinary Learning

This term our context for learning is The Lion King. This will focus on the key curricular areas of expressive arts, literacy and social studies. The key questions to be explored are:

- 1. What makes a quality performance?
- 2. What roles are needed to put on a performance?
- 3. How does effective advertising support a show?
- 4. What are the key features of a script?
