Composite Classes

We are reaching that stage in the session when classes are being discussed and organised for next year. I have a few considerations and meetings prior to finalising what the school structure will be in August 2017.

Having come from schools where composite classes had to be looked at every year, I do understand how upsetting and frustrating this can be for parents and it can also worrying for children.

There is general information on our school blog but I firmly believe that looking at the chronological age of the child is a fair and successful way to structure a class which has 2 or more year groups within it.

It is my intention then, when the school organisational structure is finally set, to composite where need be using this criteria. This often means that the age gap can be less than is normally experienced within a usual year group class. I also firmly believe that socially children from a split year group should be given the opportunity to be together as often as is possible.

I will hold an information evening as soon as classes are finalised with the parents and children involved in any composite classes within school.
