English & Literacy

Through the IDL context of Extraordinary Humans, our writing will focus on a variety of genres, including job applications, biographies and autobiographies. We will continue to develop our knowledge of Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation (VCOP), as well as building on our handwriting and spelling abilities.

Our reading in term 3 will focus on developing our skimming and scanning skills while reading for information using digital tools, as well as notetaking skills. We will be learning how to select and organise relevant facts and information about different extraordinary humans.

We offer regular opportunities for reading a range of texts for enjoyment at Mid Calder, and we would appreciate if you could continue to encourage a love for reading at home as well.

Maths & Numeracy

This term, our numeracy work will focus on fractions and multiplication and division. We will also continue to develop our mental agility through Number Talks, mental maths games and verbal recall. In our wider maths this term, the focus will be on shape, position and movement and time.

You can support your child's maths development at home by number bond revision and links to maths in real life contexts. Please encourage your child to find examples of fractions in everyday life e.g. half a pizza for dinner, half price sales, 15 minutes being a quarter of an hour etc.

Sumdog challenges for maths and reading are set up regularly and are linked to the contexts that the children are learning about in class.
