Earlier today I took 3 buttons out of our button bag – a purple one, a blue one and an orange one. (I didn't peep - really!)

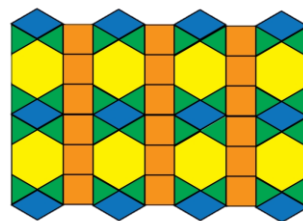
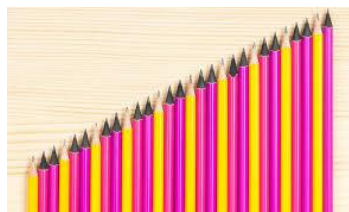
Choose just **one** question from each set below and talk about it with a grown up.
