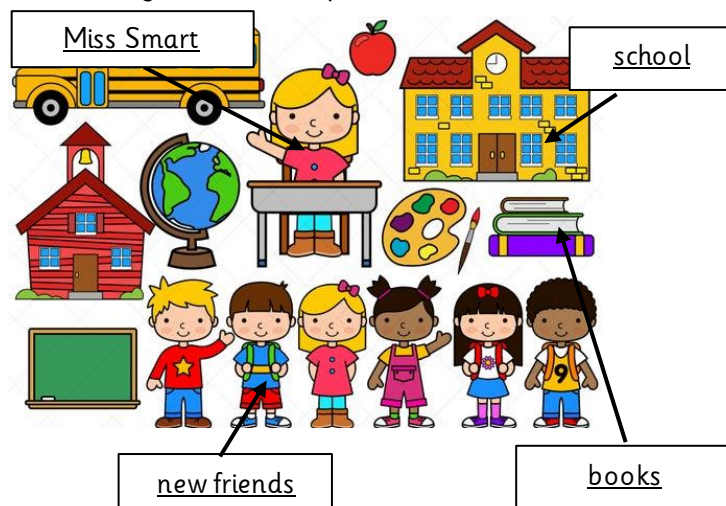
Discuss with an adult:

Example of an oral sentence using key words and labels: "I **made** new friends".

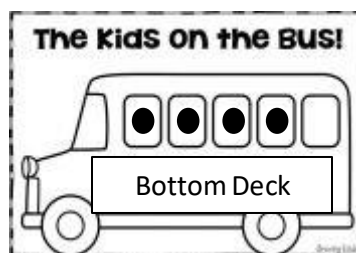
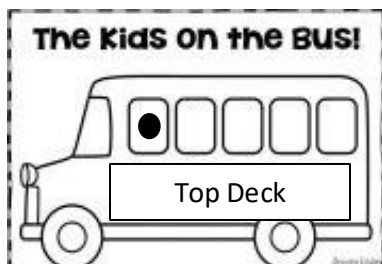
Mental Maths Warm Up



Double Decker Bus

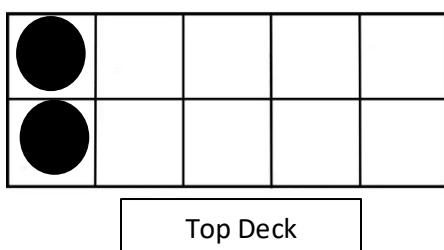
5 children are on a bus, how many different ways can we split them between the top and bottom decks?

Example: 1 child on the top deck and 4 children on the bottom deck.

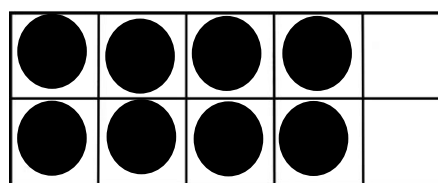


10 children are on a bus, how many different ways can we split them between the top and bottom decks this time?
