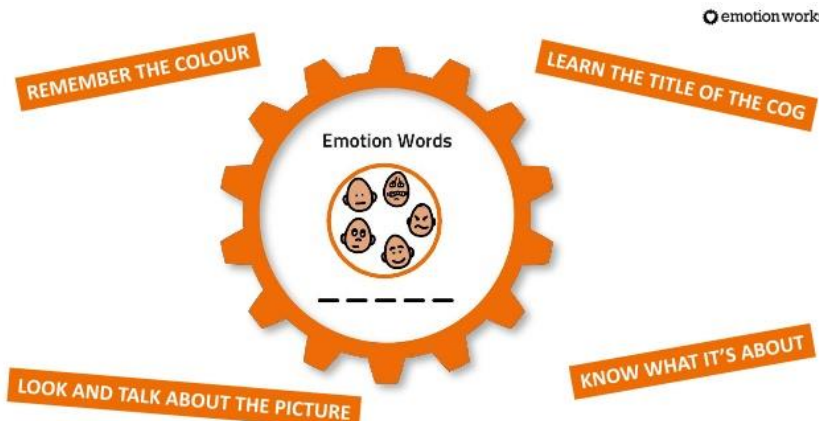

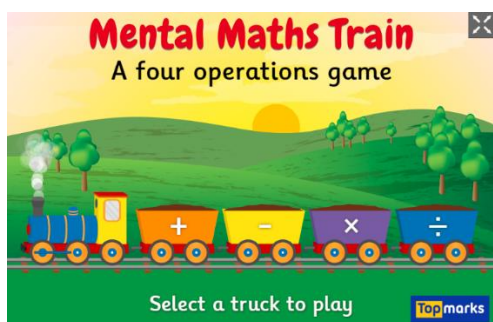

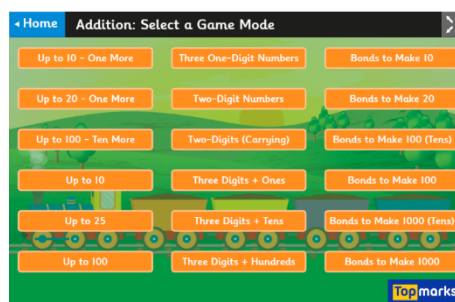
Mental Maths Warm Up
