Have a look at the picture below. Think about what we do in class when learning about recounts. We start by looking at a picture with labels and **key words**. We look at the picture, read the labels then use the key words to help share oral sentences about what might be going on. Try this with an adult.

(Use the recount above to think about which sentences you might write!)

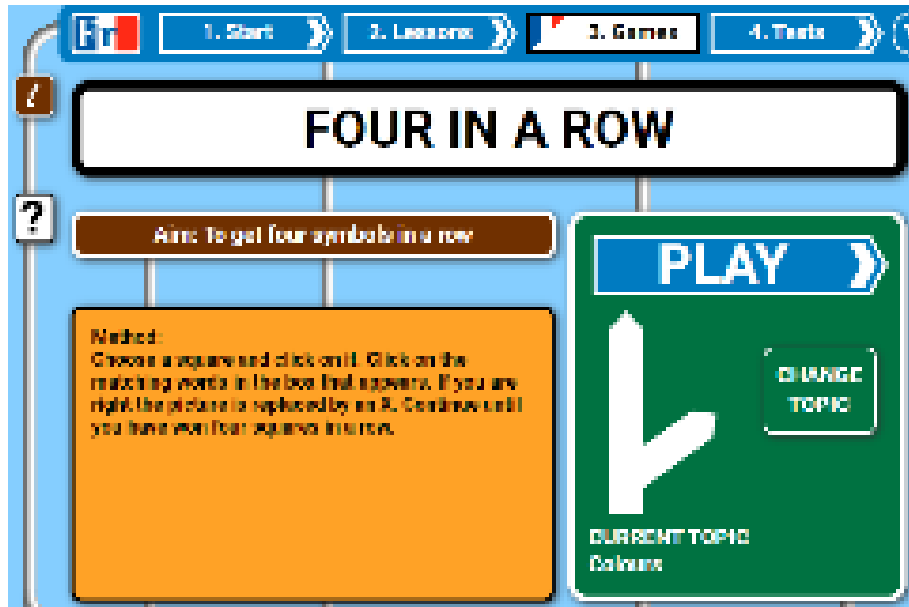
