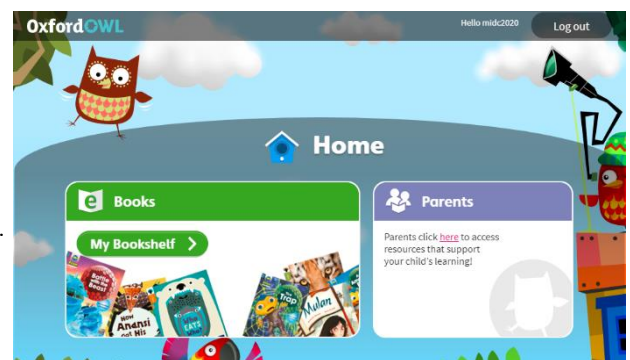

<https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/> Now click onto the pink box at the top of the page that says 'My class login'.

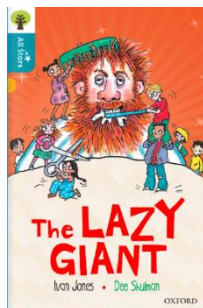

Read chapter 3

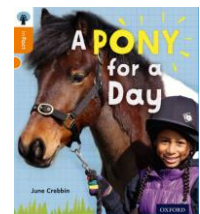
Can you describe what the giant looks like? Think about colour, size, shape, pattern and number sentences!

Read whole book

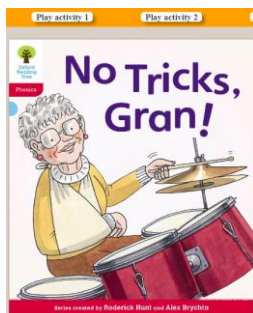

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Understanding

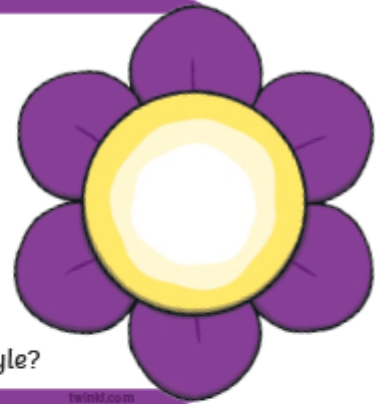
- What is the book about?

Evaluating

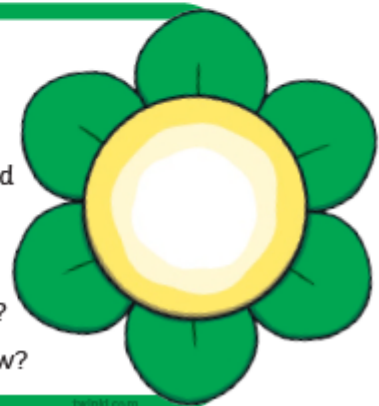
- Which text/story is better? Why?
