This week our theme is 'Comic Strips and Films'. Superheroes stories often appear in comic strips, story books and films. I wonder what some of your favourite super hero stories are?

<p>Say: Can you think about your favourite super hero story? It may be from a comic book, story book or a film. Can you discuss the questions below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Why is this your favourite super hero story? • What super powers does the super hero have? • How does the super hero save the day? • Is there a villain in the story? What do they do? • What is your favourite part of the story and why? 	<p>Write and Do: Superhero comics have been around since the 1930's – that's about 90 years ago! One of the first super hero comics was introduced by DC comics with Superman!</p> <p>Have a look at some of the superhero comic strips below or look at some of these online comics: http://www.kidscomics.online/</p> <p>Can you talk with an adult about what comic strips need to be a comic strip? The web page below helps to explain the different features of a comic strip in a nice simple way. https://community.patana.ac.th/eal/primary-eal-blog-1/year1-comic-strips</p> <p>Using one of the templates I have uploaded to the blog, have a go at making your own comic strip!</p> <p>Remember that a comic strip can have:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pictures, captions, speech bubbles, thought bubbles, action words, boxes for each part of the story etc. 	<p>Say: Imagine you are a news reporter in a superhero comic or film. See if you can get into character and report the main events of a superhero saving the day to an adult.</p> <p>Do: Have a go at a bit of flying super hero art – see 'WEEK 7 FLYING SUPERHERO' which I have uploaded on the blog for instructions!</p>

<p>Do: Lots of super heroes can be seen flying in comics and films. Have a go at the science experiment below to see if you can make a flying balloon hero!</p>		

Flying Superheroes

Science Experiment



Method

1. Draw a face on the balloons with permanent marker.
2. Blow up the balloons but do not tie them off. Keep the opening closed with your hand.
3. Using the sticky tape, attach some tissue to the slimmer end of the balloon to make a cape.
4. Let go of the balloon and watch it whizz around the room.

You will need:

Balloons
Black permanent marker
Coloured tissue paper
Sticky tape
