Emotion Works

Emotion Works uses a cog system. Each cog represents something that enables us to talk about and understand our emotions. So far we have looked at the orange 'Emotion Words' and green 'Behaviours' cog! This week we will look at the red cog called 'Body Sensations'. Body sensations are what happens to our body when we feel a certain way. It is similar to behaviours but body sensations is something we cannot control!



Here are some examples of body sensations:

- Jelly legs
- Sweaty palms
- Racing heart
- Feeling dizzy
- Butterflies in your tummy
