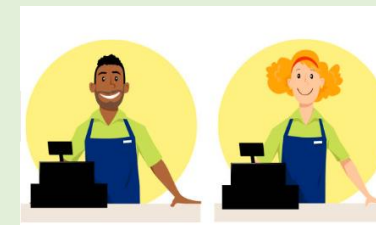
Health and Well-being

Do/Write: There are lots of different types of people who help us in everyday situations like nurses, firemen, policemen and paramedics and they all do a fantastic job. In the last month or so you will have noticed that there are lots of other people who have important jobs that help us. You may have heard these people being called 'Key Workers' – these jobs include postmen/postwomen, bus drivers, delivery drivers, supermarket workers etc. The people who do these jobs make sure that we can live our lives in the best way possible whilst we stay at home.

This week I would like you to do a bit of research to find out about the role of a key worker. It may be someone you know who works in a supermarket or delivers food. It may be your mum, dad, auntie or grandad!

In your home learning jotter you can include the following:

- A picture of the key worker (including any uniform they might wear).
- What their job title is.
- A few sentences about what their job involves.
- Why you think they are a real life super hero.
