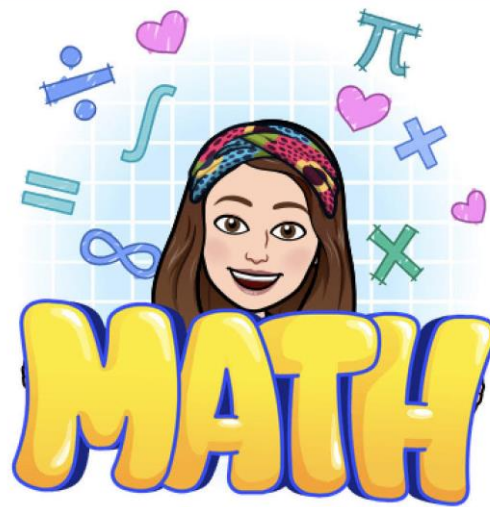

<p>-Find 5 2D shapes and 5 3D shapes around your home.</p> <p>-Record the number of faces, sides, edges and vertices for each of the shapes</p>	<p>Find five different 2D shapes in your house. Then, use those shapes to tile an area if you can, firstly one type and secondly using two of them at a time. Have a think what you could use your tiling pattern for e.g. pattern for an ornament etc.</p>	<p>Ask an adult for a selection of objects such as hair clips, socks or toys. Then sort the items by size. Once you have finished, try sorting the items a different way, e.g. by colour, pattern, shape, etc.</p>	<p>Write a list of numbers (0-50) counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, using rainbow colours.</p>
