Thank you to everyone who managed to attend our Growth Mindset Opening Morning on Friday 19th February. We had a fantastic response and were really pleased to see so many people. Murrayfield PS works hard to ensure all learners have a 'Growth Mindset'. Research shows that the way learners think about intelligence can affect their motivation to learn, the effort they put into learning and how they cope with success and failure. Teaching learners to have a 'Growth Mindset', which encourages a focus on effort rather on intelligence or talent, can help them to become high achievers in school and in later life.

Our aim is to provide a 'Growth Mindset' environment where all learners are encouraged to:

- 1. <u>LEARN, LEARN, LEARN</u>
 - It's more important for me to learn than to get top marks
- <u>HARD WORK/WORK HARD</u>
 Putting a lot of effort into learning and working hard is the key
 The harder I have to work at something, the more effort I put into something, the better I'll be at it
- 3. FACE SETBACKS

Learn from mistakes and confront deficiencies, be resilient


