Thank you to everyone who supported our Potato Reading Book Character challenge during book week. We were overwhelmed with the creativity and quality of all entries. Studies have found a significant link between reading for enjoyment and educational achievement, there is evidence that reading for enjoyment has a greater impact on a child's educational success than the family's socio-economic status and could be an important way to help combat social exclusion and raise educational standards (OECD 2002). So throughout this session there will be a variety of reading initiatives across the school to ensure all our learners develop a positive attitude and passion for reading. We will be investing in the development of our school library and regularly visit our community library and each class has been given a Golden Envelope containing funds to enhance their class library. ## <u>Norovirus</u>

Unfortunately, at this time of year many pupils and staff can be exposed to various bugs and viruses. Norovirus is very infectious and high numbers of children and staff can be affected. The symptoms of norovirus include sudden onset of nausea followed by projectile vomiting and/or diarrhoea and usually lasts 12 to 60 hours. Please read the advice from the NHS should your child experience any norovirus symptoms or sickness/diarrhoea:

The key advice for parents and staff is that anyone with symptoms must stay off school for at <u>least 48 hours</u> after symptoms have ceased and everyone should wash their hands frequently using warm water and liquid soap, especially after using the toilet and before eating or preparing food.



## Improving Whole School Approaches - January 2018

#### Golden Time

Reinforcing good behaviour while discouraging negative behaviour generally produces positive results for children, it helps children to feel good about their choices and motivates them. However, following a recent review of our dedicated Golden Time we have decided to overhaul our reward time to ensure all pupils benefit. Next session the class teacher will provide regular reward slot with high quality pupil tasks at an agreed and chosen point in the school week. Therefore rewards will be timely and appropriate. Rewards will be relevant and meaningful and created in discussion with learners. Further information will be shared in the new session

## Vertical Groups

We have revamped our Vertical Group sessions to ensure our learners receive creative and engaging learning experiences. Once a month P1-3 and P4-7, learners will have the opportunity to work together on a variety of tasks building skill for life, work and learning. Tasks include den building, food technology, bikeability, outdoor games and many more. Please ensure your child is appropriately dress if they are participating in any outdoor activities.

## Regional Collaborative - Forth Valley and West Lothian Collaborative

Schools across Scotland will now have the opportunity work with other authorities to be able to draw on a range of expertise through six newly established Regional Improvement Collaboratives. West Lothian Council is part of the Forth Valley and West Lothian Collaborative which also includes Clackmannanshire, Falkirk and Stirling Councils.

Each one will be led by a Regional Improvement Lead and will work with schools, using all available evidence, to provide targeted advice and support to drive improvement.

The leads have been appointed by agreement of Local Authority Chief Executives in each regional collaborative, and the Scottish Government advised by the Interim Chief Inspector of Education.

The leads will be responsible for ensuring a detailed Improvement Plan in consultation with their schools and headteachers is in place for each area by 2018. Scottish Government officials, along with Education Scotland, will meet shortly with each collaborative to support this detailed planning process. Further information will be shared throughout this session.

## Scottish National Standardised Assessment - SNSA

Assessment is a central part of everyday learning and teaching for every child and young person. The Scottish National Standardised Assessments have been introduced as part of the <u>National Improvement</u> <u>Framework for Scottish Education</u> to provide teachers with objective, comparable information about progress, which will help improve outcomes for all children and young people.

These assessments have been specifically designed to reflect the way we deliver education in Scotland and are aligned with Curriculum for Excellence. Ongoing and periodic assessments are, and will continue to be, the main basis of teachers' professional judgement. Teachers continue to draw on all of the assessment information available to them when considering children's progress and planning next steps in learning. Our P7 learners have recently completed their literacy/language and numeracy/maths assessments and following robust analysis we have identified key areas for improvement: Literacy and language

- grammar
- inferential questions being able to read between the lines

Numeracy and Maths

 word problems — being able to select the most relevant numerical/mathematical process and to apply skills and knowledge

We will now look at our learning pathways and teaching approaches to ensure we provide learners with a depth and breadth of activities to develop the identified key areas.
