

PUSCPS – LEARNING OVERVIEW

P4 – Term 3 (January - April)

The main focus for learning this term will be:

Local Mapping/Environment

Literacy

Reading: The class will be reading different short novels this term. This will help them develop and consolidate their skills in reading and also, encourage them to read more often. As well as this, all the children will be continuing with their reading books. Our main focus this term is to questions each other more when reading in groups and to give personal opinions about what we read. The children will also be further developing their skills when reading for information through different sources during research into different Scottish people and the history of Livingston. We will also be striving to have ERIC time every day.

Writing: The children will be doing a variety of styles of writing e.g. imaginative and functional, through their topic of Local Area. They will also continue developing their core skills - capital letters, full stops, finger spaces and connectives. We will be taking surveys and using the information to further our understanding of housing and local area usage.

Handwriting: We have identified the letters which we find difficult to write in cursive and we will focus on these to begin with. We will then continue to work on joining our letters and using cursive in our work.

Spelling: The class will be exploring spelling patterns and continuing to develop their sight words.

Listening and Talking: Children will be developing their questioning skills through discussion and links with their reading. The children will be given the opportunity to contribute to group and class discussions across the curriculum and participate in weekly circle time activities.
