

PUSCPS – LEARNING OVERVIEW P1– Term 4 (April - June 2019)

This is an overview of all P1 learning. These experiences may be differentiated to support or challenge each child.

The main focus for learning this term will be: 'The Sea'

Literacy

Listening and Talking

- Class talking Box
- Sharing ideas with talking partners.
- Maths Talk partner discussions
- Sharing ideas and thoughts across learning.
- Identifying rhyme in poems and stories
- Generating own rhyming words.
- Listening for the sounds they hear in words for reading and writing

<u>Writing</u>

These skills will be developed through different writing genres

- Forming own ideas or a sentence more independently.
- Describing a setting.
- Continuing to add further detail to pictures.
- Mark-making in play using different materials.
- Mark-making alongside pictures to label or tell stories.
- Continue to form taught letters and writing on lines.
- To continue to write sentences using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops
- Begin to use connectives to make sentences longer, e.g. and / but
- Continue to use descriptive language.
- Writing common words and use these correctly in writing.
- Developing a 'have a go' attitude in writing to increase independence.
- Writing words more independently through listening for individual sounds
- Using vowel sounds in writing (ay/ai/oo/ew/ee/oi/oy/ow/ou/igh/aw/aw, etc).

<u>Reading</u>

- Continue to blend 2/3 sounds to read short words.
- Reading increasing number of common words.
- Making inferences from the text.
- Answering questions to show understanding.
- Identifying rhyme in texts.
- Creating new texts and pictures from ideas in texts.

Numeracy

- Number: counting in 2s and 10s / number words / forward and backward sequencing / vocabulary of more and less / missing numbers to 20 / talking about number in various ways / simple addition games through play / simple subtraction within 10.
- **Fractions:** Split a whole into smaller parts and explains that equal parts are the same size. / use appropriate vocabulary to describe halves. / Shares out a group of items equally into smaller groups.
- Measure: length / weight / capacity describes common objects using measurement language / compare lengths / estimate lengths
- Money: continue to develop recognition of coins / making amounts using a range of coins

Health and Wellbeing

- Continue to help to prepare food and consider food hygiene
- Ongoing experiences through play and learning or circle time turn taking / talking about emotions / people who
 we can trust, etc.

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Interdisciplinary Learning

<u>The Sea</u> (Social Studies, Expressive Arts & Literacy) – The P1 children are leading our IDL planning and learning this term. The learning will follow the children's interests about the ocean.
