

PUSCPS – LEARNING OVERVIEW

P1- Term 3 (January - April 2020)

This is an overview of all P1 learning. These experiences may be differentiated to support or challenge each child.

The main focus for learning this term will be: 'Katie Morag' & 'Let it Grow – Life Cycles'

Literacy

Listening and Talking

- · Performing at class assembly.
- Sharing ideas with talking partners.
- Speaking to an audience clearly
- Maths Talk partner discussions
- Sharing ideas and thoughts across learning.
- Identifying rhyme in poems and stories
- Generating own rhyming words.
- Identifying sounds in words for reading and writing

Writing

These skills will be developed through different writing genres

- Mark-making in play using different materials.
- Mark-making alongside pictures to label or tell stories.
- Form taught letters.
- To write a sentence using finger spaces, capital letter and full stops
- Beginning to use descriptive language.
- Writing common words and beginning to use these within writing.
- Developing a 'have a go' attitude in writing to increase independence.
- Writing some words more independently through listening for individual sounds
- Beginning to use vowel sounds in writing (ay/ai/oo/ew/ee/oi/oy/ow/ou/igh, etc)

Reading

- Blending 2/3 sounds to read short words.
- Reading common words.
- Recognising word boundaries and spaces.
- Making predictions about stories from picture clues.
- Answering questions about characters, setting and events.
- Identifying non-fiction texts and their features.
- Creating new texts and pictures from ideas in texts.

Numeracy

- **Number**: addition stories to 5 or 10 / counting on strategies for addition / doubles and near doubles / estimation of an amount using language of less / more / longer / shorter
- Money: recognising coins and beginning to add coins to find a total.
- **Time:** sequencing months and days / exploring calendars / seasons / reading an analogue and digital clock for half past times.
- Information Handling: exploring simple bar charts and graphs / collecting data and displaying in different ways.

Health and Wellbeing

- Relationships: friendships / caring / sharing
- Food: tasting food from different cultures / helping to prepare food and considering food hygiene

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- · Recognises colour, line, shape. Begin to explore pattern and texture.
- Shares thoughts and feelings about music experiences such as live and/or recorded music.
- Describes how weather affects the activities they can undertake and how you feel about different types of weather.
- Exploring different Scottish land features.
- Describing characters and settings from familiar stories.
- Creating texts linked to Scottish island life, e.g. postcards, lists, invitations.

Let it Grow (Science, Maths & Technologies)

- Describing the stages in the life cycles of a chicken, butterfly and frog, learning how living things develop and grow
- Monitor the growth of living things
- Discovering how to care for living things
- Discovering what makes plants grow, labelling the parts of a plant
- Learning about what a living thing needs to grow
- Creating models of different life cycles using range of materials
- Measuring: length and weight. Comparing heights and weights.
- Designing a house for a living thing using a design specification.
- Creating a video diary of progress of a living thing.
