

The main focus for learning this term will be:

Literacy
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reading - group focus on fiction. Children will develop skills for asking/answering questions and further explore character/setting. They will also explore examples of Scots' texts. Grammar will focus on verbs, proper nouns and joining words. Children will visit the library regularly to promote reading for enjoyment and begin to record this in their Reading Passports. Phonics - exploring/consolidating letter patterns. Common words. Magic "e" words Writing - will link to Scots' focus and then class topic. Children will plan/create an imaginative piece linked to 'Maisie' stories. Using illustrations/speech bubbles. Using connectives to link sentences. Handwriting - developing letter formation. Listening and Talking - performing Scots' poetry; applying tools for listening and talking in group situations. French - parts of the body. 'Camembear's birthday'. Saying how old I am.
