## CfE First Level Homework Grid

Complete four activities and connect them in the grid using either a horizontal line or vertical line. This will provide you with a literacy, a mathematics, a kindness and an outdoor learning experience.

Write a letter to Santa. Remember to begin with 'Dear Santa' and end with 'from'.

Go for a festive walk and count as many Christmas trees as you can. If you go after sunset, you might get to see everyone's Christmas lights too

Bake a festive treat for someone.



Count how many baubles are on uour Christmas tree.

Do a kind favour for someone to help them feel festive!

Follow a recipe and make a gingerbread man or even a gingerbread house!

Make a pattern in your house. You could use tinsel on the Christmas tree, presents under the tree, Christmas cards, bauble or even ornaments.

Make a snowman (if it has been snowing) or make your own snowflakes using newspaper or white paper. Use them to decorate uour house.

Make an outdoor festive picture using materials such as sticks, stones and fallen leaves.



Before decorating your Christmas tree, sort the baubles into different colours. How many other ways can you sort the baubles?

Make a Christmas card for someone and write a kind message inside.

Make someone a homemade gift. You could make a candy cane decoration using a pipe cleaner and beads or a festive picture.

Make Christmas tree baubles by cutting different coloured card into at least four different shapes. Design patterns or pictures on them, then pierce small holes in them and thread through pieces of ribbon to attach them to the Christmas tree.

Sing a Christmas carol to someone to spread Christmas cheer.



Find a tree which has lots of fallen leaves under it. Count how manu leaves are on the ground.



Help an adult with their Christmas jobs. You could write all the gift tags for presents!
