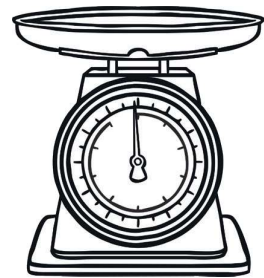
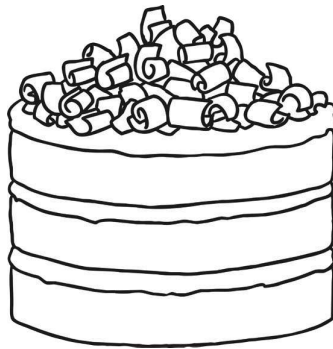


Kitchen Measuring
