We know that young people in West Lothian also want to look after the planet and we thought one way we could celebrate this was by setting up a poem competition, that any primary school in West Lothian could participate in.

To get you in the mood, we have given you some facts about some of the things we do.

(Once you have read these you can read activity 1 and activity 2).

Fact number 1

Did you know that sewage, food waste and non-recyclable household waste can be transformed into renewable energy! Last year, across the whole of the UK, Veolia converted enough of these waste types to power 1.2 million homes for a one whole year. Some of these wastes even came from West Lothian!

Fact number 2

Glass bottles and jars can be turned into material for keeping your home warm (we call this home insulation). In fact, 350 million glass bottles and jars were turned into home insulation this year by Veolia. THATS A LOT OF GLASS!!

Fact number 3

Did you know plastic milk bottles can be recycled into new plastic food packaging. Every year we return 300 million plastic milk bottles into small plastic pellets, so that they can be turned into new food packaging!! Can you count to 300 million? How far did you get?
