


### Curriculum Design


#### Behaviour

### Literacy Overview

We are currently reviewing staff training in literacy. We have created a literacy overview for staff but thought we would share with the parents to allow you to see the expectations across the school. A consistent approach was required to ensure expectations are high for all learners. This will continue to evolve as we explore a variety of literacy approaches.

Learning and teaching remains a relentless focus in order to raise attainment for all children in our school. After our recent VSE we developed a shared approach which is visible from P1-P7. The 4 symbols link to clear lesson focus and ensuring learners learn more whilst teachers ensure they meet the needs of all learners. Five of our current team are completing the Outstanding Teaching Intervention to continue to raise standards in our school.
