Question we want to explore:

Strengths identified:

- Strong classroom routines and high expectations, use of success stairway reinforced this
- #5star theme supported high expectations across the school
- Effective links made to word boost to remind pupils of high expectations of vocabulary
- Pupil levels of engagement and motivation were high and it was apparent that they clearly enjoyed their writing lessons
- Evidence of open questioning with pupils
- Talk partners and peer assessment used well in first level, where teachers spent time modelling how peer assessment works

- Learning intentions and success criteria shared clearly and consistently revisited
- Classroom supports learning activity- use of literacy targets
- Use of technology to support learning- clear investment in the use of devices, collaborative learning supported through the use of technology
- Structure of mighty writer supports learner confidence and certainty about structure and expectations
- Class teachers clearly aware of pupils requiring additional support and challenge, this was evident through class teacher observation and assessment of pupils
