



I can include all the key features of the WAGOLL.




This is when we'd normally do our purple pen work!

Check 1- Does your writing make sense? Have you missed any words out?

Read it through slowly and out loud!



Check 2- CAPITAL LETTERS!

Do you have a CL at the start of every sentence?

Do you have a CL for specific names (proper nouns)? Remember when we played the proper nouns game? It's not just a city... it's Edinburgh, it's not just a brother it's Tim etc...

Check 3- Punctuation- have you used the correct punctuation at the end of your sentences?


for normal sentences

Check 4- Have you organised your writing into paragraphs?

Is all the writing in each paragraph about the same thing (e.g. the first week of lockdown)

Check 5-Do you spellings look sensible? If not, sound them out again or look in a dictionary.


