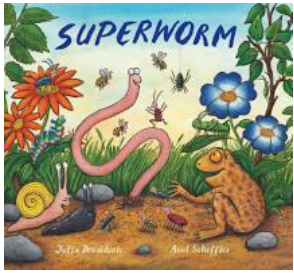


Minibeasts!
