<p>Aim: To identify rhyming words with the –en sound.</p> <p>Ten men and a hen sat in a den!</p> <p>Spot the rhyming –en words in this sentence.</p> <p>Draw a picture of this silly sentence.</p> <p>Extra challenge: Can you think of another sentence using rhyming –en words?</p>	<p>Aim: To practice reading tricky words. Tricky Words – Week 1</p> <p>I the he she me we be was to do</p> <p>Practice reading these words. In each word, can you say which letter is the ‘trick’ that stops you being able to sound out the word. For example, the ‘e’ in ‘he’ makes an ‘ee’ sound rather than an ‘e’ sound.</p> <p>Perhaps you could write the words out. Then you could cut the words up and get a family member to hide them around the house. Look for the words and read them when you find them.</p>	<p>Aim: To think of relevant questions and recall the answers.</p> <p>Play ‘What’s hiding behind my back?’</p> <p>To play this game an adult or older sibling chooses an object to hide behind their back. Now think of questions to try to work out what the mystery object is. The person hiding the objects can only answer ‘Yes’ or ‘No’. Initially good questions would be general and then become more specific.</p>
