<p>Aim: To write, say and identify capital letters.</p> <p>Use the Windyknowe uppercase letter formation worksheet in your pack to help.</p> <p>Have a go writing the letters – C, M, N, O, P, U, V, W, X, Y, Z</p> <p>Make sure you start at the dot and follow the arrow.</p> <p>These letters are the same as the lower case letters we have already learned but remember they are bigger and sit differently on the line.</p> <p>Extra challenge – Pick 3 capital letters and think of a person’s name or a place that begins with that letter.</p>	<p>Aim: To read for information.</p> <p>Have a go at reading the following. Ask an adult to read it with you if you need some help. You can see it in a larger font on the next page. Letter pairs that make one sound are underlined. Silent letters are not in bold.</p> <p>‘A pig has piglets. A <u>g</u>oat has a kid. A horse has a <u>f</u>oal. A <u>s</u>heep has a lamb. A cat has kittens. A rabbit has kittens too.’</p> <p>Answer the following questions:</p> <p>What does a <u>g</u>oat have?</p> <p>What does a rabbit have?</p> <p>What does a <u>s</u>heep have?</p>	<p>Aim: To speak loudly and clearly.</p> <p>Pick your favourite toy.</p> <p>Describe your toy to someone in your house.
