| <p><u>Aim:</u> To practise counting in tens</p> <p>Practise counting in tens to 100 with Jack Hartmann on you tube!</p> <p>Have fun moving and dancing as you count up in tens!</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=tw9uMTSMevg</p> <p>Alternatively, you could practise counting in tens by making up a game where you get 10 points each time you score. E.g. Knock down empty bottles with a balled-up pairs of socks, throw a ball of scrunched-up tinfoil into some mugs or bowls, throw and catch a ball without dropping it.</p> <p><u>Extra challenge:</u> If it is easy for you to count in 10s learn how to count in 5s. Say this pattern out loud and then see if you can continue it. It could be a dice and counters pathway type of game or a matching card pairs game.
