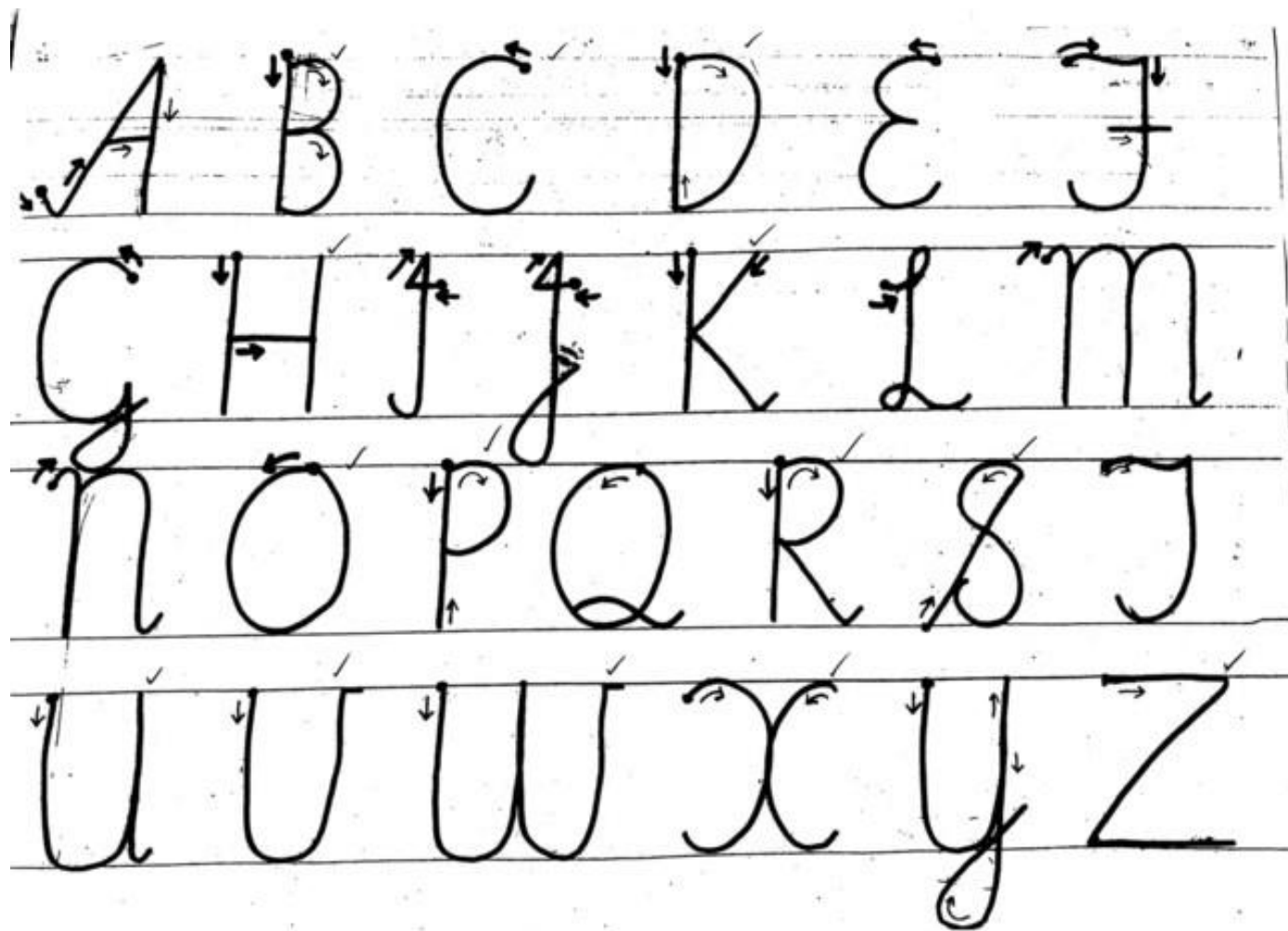

Handwriting Task 1	Reading Task 2	Talking Task 3
<p>Aim: To write, say and identify capital letters.</p> <p>Please use the Windyknowe uppercase letter formation worksheet in your pack to help. A copy of this can also be found below.</p> <p>Have a go at writing these capital letters. Adults may wish to dictate the words beside each letter below. Use a lined page to practise positioning them correctly on the lines.</p> <p>T – Start just below top line and do a curved line underneath the top line. Now draw a line downwards and then curve it once you get down to the bottom.</p> <p>F – (This is same as T but with an added line). Start just below top line and do a curved line underneath the top line. Now draw a line downwards and then curve it once you get down to the bottom. Lift your pencil and draw a line through the middle of the line that reaches the bottom.</p> <p>Z – Start at the top line and draw a straight line going right and then draw a diagonal line downwards to the bottom line. Now draw another straight line along the bottom line. You should do this without lifting your pencil.</p> <p><u>Extra challenge</u> – Can you think of a person’s name or a place that begins with today’s capital letters?</p>	<p>Aim: To read for information.</p> <p>Have a go at reading the following. Ask an adult to read it with you if you need some help. The text is on the next page in a larger font.</p> <p>‘A dad fox is a dog. A mum fox is a vixen. A baby fox is a cub. The tail is a brush. The tail is a brush. Foxes live in dens. Foxes dig dens under the ground. Foxes hunt in the dark at night.’</p> <p>Answer the following questions (this can be done orally and you don’t need to write the answers):</p> <p>What is a dad fox called? What is a mum fox called? What is there tail like? Where do foxes live? When do foxes hunt?</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge:</u> Write the answers to the questions in sentences in your jotter. Copy the correct spelling of words from the text.</p>	<p>Aim: To speak loudly and clearly.</p> <p>Choose a familiar story that you enjoy.</p> <p>For example, a good choice for this may be something like the ‘The Gruffalo’ or ‘Goldilocks and the Three Bears’.</p> <p>Now retell this story in your own words!</p> <p>Have a go at using different voices for each character and try to add expression to show how they are feeling.</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge:</u> Perform another story to someone in your household! Can they guess what the story is you are retelling?</p>
