Numeracy Task 1	Money Task 2
<p><u>Aim:</u> To identify odd and even numbers in my environment</p> <p>When you are outside spot numbers on houses or car number plates. Can you say if each number is odd or even? Remember to look at the last number. If it ends in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 it is even. If it ends in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 it is odd.</p> <p><u>Extra challenge:</u> Play this odd and even numbers game.</p> <p>Espresso education > first level > Maths > Multiplication and Division > activities > odd and even</p> <p>https://central.espresso.co.uk/espresso/primary_uk/subject/module/activity/item802289/grade1/module784709/index.html?source=search-all-all-all&source-keywords=odd%20and%20even</p>	<p><u>Aim:</u> To estimate an amount of money</p> <p>You will need a mix of 1p, 2p 5p and 10p coins.</p> <p>This will practise quick coin identification and develop understanding of coin values.</p> <p>Get an adult to pick about 4 coins without you seeing them. The adult will then show you the coins for only a few seconds. Can you make an estimate (a sensible guess) of the total value of these coins? Think about the number of tens you saw to give you a clue. Remember that two 5p coins will make 10p. Next count the coin total together and see how close you were. Repeat a few times. Are you getting better at estimating?</p> <p>If this is a little tricky use 3 coins or remove the 5p coins. If this is easy use 5 coins.</p>
