MW learned to ride her bike without stabilisers. She has also been helping around the house with cleaning, dishes and folding clothes.

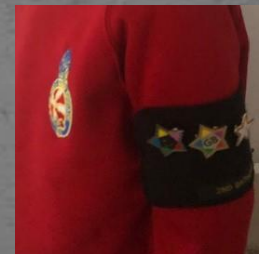
TE made a pizza for her lunch and then used it to show fractions.

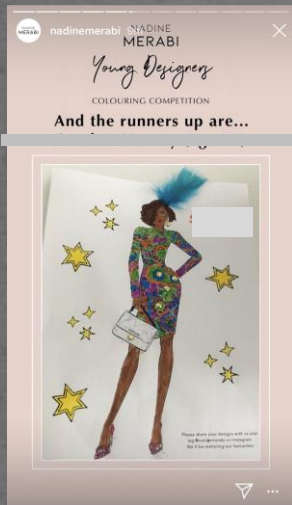
MR achieved his Scottish Gymnastics Award Level 5
