<p>Aim: To retell a story.</p> <p>Have a listen to ‘The Hungry Caterpillar’ being read by the author Eric Carle:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eXHScpo Vv8</p> <p>Think of the main events and the main character of the story. Then try drawing the beginning, middle and end of the story in 3 different drawings.</p> <p>Now have a go at writing a few sentences retelling the story of ‘The Hungry Caterpillar’. If this is a little tricky then label each of your drawings with a few words.</p> <p>Remember finger spaces between words, letters on the lines and full stops. At this stage your child will be spelling using the sounds they hear and the sounds they know.</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge:</u> Write the days of the week and either write or draw what the caterpillar ate on each day!</p>	<p>Aim: To read words with the wh sound.</p> <p>Watch the following video of Geraldine the Giraffe talking about the ‘wh’ sound:</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vuYZVrh1iPc</p> <p>Read the spelling words by sounding them out. Underlined letters make one sound together. These can be found in larger font below.</p> <p>wheel whisk when whirl whack whip</p> <p>Choose 3 words to write down and draw. The words are on the next page in a larger font.</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge:</u> Read the trickier words on the challenge list below.</p>	<p>Aim: To listen to and identify rhyming words.</p> <p>Have a go at completing the rhyming worksheet in the most recent paper pack.</p> <p><u>Extra challenge:</u> Read this sentence to someone and see if they can spot the rhyming words or ask an adult to read the sentence to you and listen out for the rhyming words!</p> <p style="text-align: center; font-size: 2em;">The dog went for a jog in the fog.</p>
