You could even make a thank you card to someone telling them why you are thankful for them.</p> <p>You will need to fold your paper in half like a little book. Now design the front of your card with title and a picture.</p> <p>Then inside write who the card is for and a small message of what you want to say (you can ask adult to help you with this part if it is a little tricky).</p> <p>Don’t forget to write your name at the bottom!</p> <p><u>Extra challenge</u> – Can you make your own envelope to put your card inside?
