<p>Aim: To write a set of instructions</p> <p>It is very important to wash your hands properly. How would you describe the process from start to finish to someone who had never washed their hands before? (like Grubby Gertrude from The World’s Worst Children by David Walliams) </p> <p>Write a short set of instructions on how wash your hands properly.</p> <p>If this is a little tricky, then draw the process step by step and label your drawings with a few words.</p> <p>Remember finger spaces between words, letters on the lines and full stops. At this stage your child will be spelling using the sounds they hear and the sounds they know.</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge</u>: Can you use your instructions and get a family member to follow them?</p>	<p>Aim: To read words with the gr sound.</p> <p>Watch the following video of Geraldine the Giraffe talking about the ‘gr’ sound:  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FwVSSxC3h0U">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FwVSSxC3h0U</a></p> <p>Google ‘You tube Geraldine the Giraffe gr’</p> <p>Read the spelling words by sounding them out. These can be found in larger font below.</p> <p>Choose 3 words to write down and draw.</p> <p><u>Extra Challenge</u>: Read the trickier words on the challenge list below.</p>	<p>Aim: To tell an imaginative sentence using a word with a given sound</p> <p><u>I’m going to the seaside game</u></p> <p>In this game, the rule is you can only take something to the seaside if it begins with the letter ‘s’.</p> <p>Take turns e.g. “I’m going to the seaside and I’m going to take my <b>s</b>ocks”. “I’m going to the seaside and I’m going to take my <b>s</b>.....</p> <p>Keep going until you run out of ideas or someone makes a mistake, then change the letter if you want to play again.</p>
