<p><b><u>LI: to write a narrative</u></b>  <b><u>A narrative is there to entertain the reader.</u></b></p> <p>4 key parts to a description are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Title</li> <li>Orientation (Who? When? Where?)</li> <li>Complication</li> <li>Resolution</li> </ol> <p>We are going to write a narrative today and it is up to you to choose your character, setting, complication and resolution.</p> <p><b>Some title ideas:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Desert Island</li> <li>Lost in the Jungle</li> <li>Shipwrecked!</li> <li>The Runaway Pizza</li> </ul> <p>Please feel free to create your own. These are just suggestions for you.</p>	<p><b>Do a quick plan and answer these questions</b> (you do not need to use sentences, small words are great here!)</p> <p>Who is the story?  When does the story happen?  Where does the story happen?</p> <p>What goes wrong?</p> <p>How is it fixed?</p> <p><b>Write your narrative.</b></p> <p>Miss Foote has put some reminders in the next box for you.</p>	<p><b>Reminders</b></p> <p>Order your story like this:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Title</li> <li>Orientation (Who? When? Where?)</li> <li>Complication</li> <li>Resolution</li> </ol> <p>Vocabulary – use WOW words (adjectives) to describe as much as you can in your story. You want the reader to be entertained.</p> <p>Okay vocabulary – the <b>big</b> elephant  Good vocabulary – the <b>huge</b> elephant  Excellent vocabulary – the <b>enormous</b> elephant</p> <p>Onomatopoeias – CRASH! BANG! WHOOSH!</p> <p>Full stops and capital letters must be in the correct places</p> <p>Can you use any of the follow punctuation?  Exclamation marks    Question marks  Speech marks</p>
