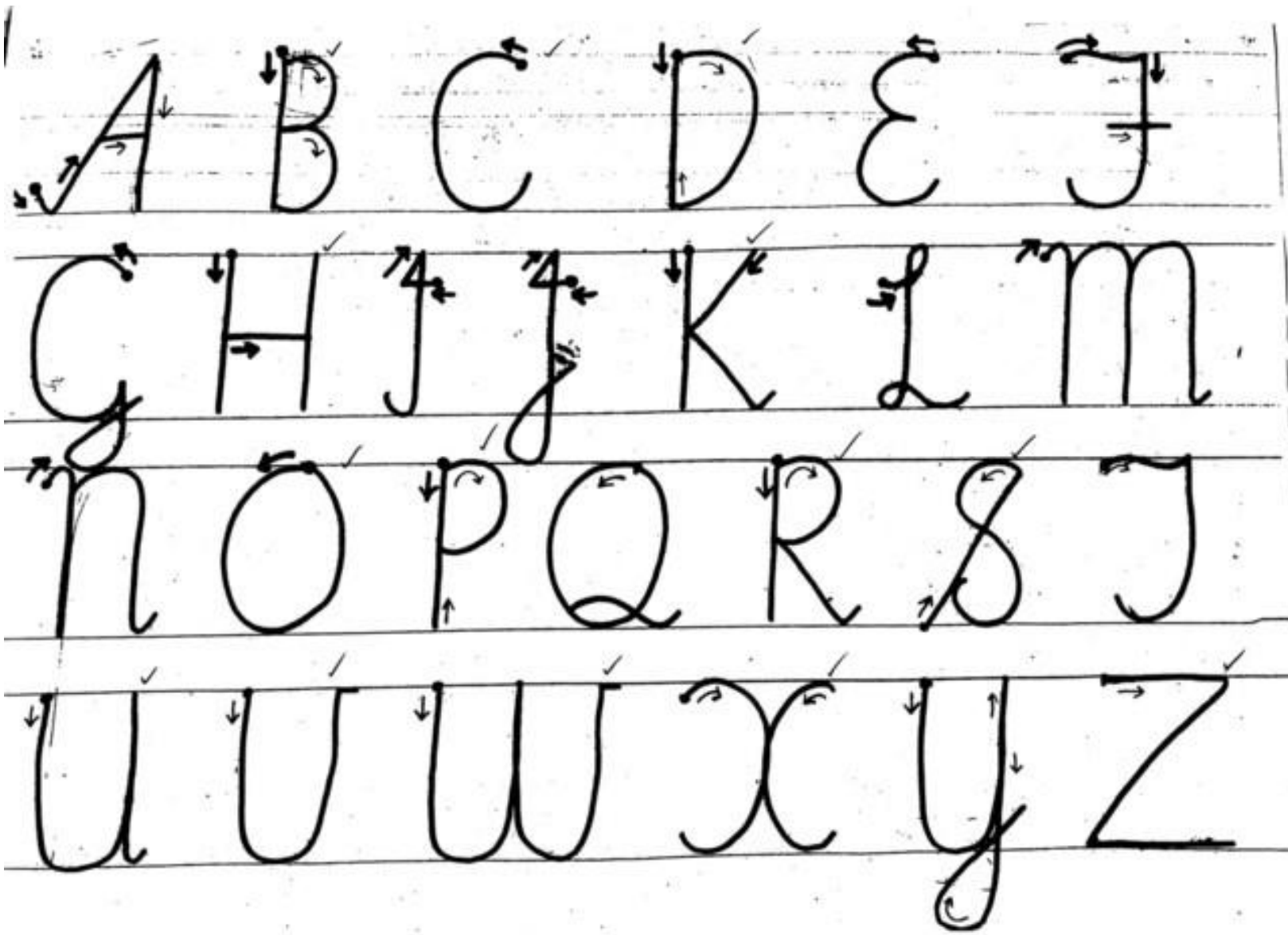

<p>Aim: To write, say and identify capital letters.</p> <p>Please use the Windyknowe uppercase letter formation worksheet in your pack to help. A copy of this can also be found below.</p> <p>Have a go at writing these capital letters. Adults may wish to dictate the words beside each letter below. Use a lined page to practise positioning them correctly on the lines.</p> <p>E – Start at the top and draw a curved line that comes in halfway before doing the same again, almost like writing backwards number 3.</p> <p>C – Start at the top of the line and draw a curved line round like a half moon shape.</p> <p>O – Start at the top and draw a curved line continuously round till it meets again at the top.</p> <p><u>Extra challenge</u> – Can you think of some children’s names or pet names that begin with today’s capital letter?</p>	<p>Aim: To read for information.</p> <p>Have a go at reading the following. Ask an adult to read it with you if you need some help. The text is on the next page in a larger font.</p> <p>“Jessica is going apple picking with her sister Maria. They are going to the apple orchard near their house. They need to pick twelve apples. Mum is going to make a big apple pie. At the orchard, Jessica picked nine apples and Maria picked three. They had a fun day together and they can’t wait to enjoy their pie with some cream!”</p> <p>Answer the following questions (this can be done orally and you don’t need to write the answers):</p> <p>Where is Jessica going?            Who is she going with?            How many apples do they need?
