Staffing update- September 2019

Nursery

This session our Early Learning and Child care provision has changed as West Lothian Council moves closer to providing children and families with 1140 hours of quality Early Learning and Child care. (ELCC)This session our session structures now provide 1000 hours of ELCC over 50 weeks.

Session organisation for Williamston Nursery is **Monday – Thursday** AM 8.00-12.45pm PM 1.15pm-6.00pm or two full day sessions (Mon- Thurs of parental choice).

Williamston Nursery will now be open 50 weeks of the year for all Nursery pupils and only closing completely over the Christmas holiday period.

Staffing structure has now been increased to allow us to provide the full sessions.

We are delighted to welcome **Ms Karren Allan** as **Early Years Officer** and **Jacqui McMorran** as **Nursery Nurse** full time to the team .

School

<u>Mrs Karlie Gray Principal Teacher</u> began her maternity leave on Monday 26th August and is preparing and resting before the birth of her twins in early September – we wish her all the very best and are looking forward to meeting the babies soon.

<u>Mrs Roisin Thomson Principal Teacher</u> who will work this session Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and will be taking over the role of Additional Support Needs.

Mrs Sharon Blair P7a class teacher will be Acting Principal Teacher – Thursday Friday to provide the school with a full complement of Principal Teacher cover for this session. We are looking forward to working with Mrs Blair.

Terrific Tuesdays – Tuesday 3rd September

Last session, as part of our ongoing commitment to working in partnership with our parents and carers, we developed our family learning opportunities and introduced 'Terrific Tuesdays'. This was an opportunity every Tuesday from 8:55am until 9:25am across our classes P1-P7 where we welcomed any parent/carer who wished to come into class and spend time participating in smart start learning activities. Following feedback from parents/carers and staff this



session we will continue to offer a similar opportunity across different days in the week and in blocks across the session.

We will be beginning with 'Terrific Tuesdays' from Tuesday 3rd September for 4 weeks.

3rd TERRIFIC TUESDAYS – BLOCK 1-4 3/9 10/9 24/9 1/10

This is open to parents /carers and/or grandparents. This is an informal opportunity and there is no compulsion or expectation for there to be a representative for each child or each week. You may be able to come regularly or possibly once only in the block or over the session. If you have more than one child in the school, we advise that you alternate your planned visits. The opportunity is intended to be open and flexible. If you are able to come along this will give you the opportunity to come into your child's class and learn alongside them and engage in the smart start activities that teachers plan for classes. Please remember that this will not be an opportunity to discuss individual children's progress with their teacher as this is a busy time of the day. Also remember to leave promptly at 9:25am to allow quality learning and teaching to continue.

Management of Allergies- We Are a NUT FREE School

We have a number of children and staff in our school who have nut allergies which can be life threatening, the condition can also be triggered by sitting next to someone eating a product that may contains nuts.



Therefore, in order to keep our school a nut free school, we would be grateful if you would ensure that your child does not bring any snacks containing nuts or nut products for break or in their packed lunch i.e. Nutella, Cereal Bars with nuts, Snickers and Peanut Butter. If your child has been asked to bring "junk boxes" into school by their teacher, please ensure the boxes/containers do not have any nut products in the ingredient list. School uniform does not include 'hoodies'.

<u>School car park and Bankton Lane – Reminder to</u> all parents.

<u>Please can we remind all parents that the school turning circle and collection procedures are as</u> follows;



Firstly, we would encourage as many as possible to walk, cycle and scoot to school. However, if coming by car is the only option can we ask that the following is observed by car park users. We have been visited by the police recently and they have advised that to ensure safety of children and road users the following is observed;

Nursery area

This should be used only by parents and carers dropping off and collecting from the nursery.

Morning use of Car park -8.00am onwards.

Nursery update

Our Nursery now operates from 8.00am. Nursery parking area should be kept clear for only Nursery parents at this time and should not be used by parents using Breakfast club.

In the mornings, we operate a <u>drop off only</u>. Parents should use the whole of the drop off zone to drop off their children from cars. We advise that parents let children out of cars on the pavement side and we recommend that they then watch them enter the school from the nearest playground (the upper end) or escort them briefly to the school gate. One of our PSW is on duty in this playground from 8.30am. Parents should not be parking and escorting children round to other entrances such as the gate on Bankton Lane or the central playground. This has a significant impact on the operation of the system in the mornings.

If you wish to escort your child to school via the Bankton Lane gate and then into the playground, do not use the car park. We advise that you park legally elsewhere.

Please do not;

- Park in the drop off zone (Mornings only)
- Park in Bankton Lane
- Park in clearly marked yellow boxes or marked do not park.

Please do;

- Use the drop off zone as a 'drop off 'only.
- reduce speed when entering and leaving the car park (20 mph)
- Be courteous and considerate to other road users

Afternoon use of Car park.

In the afternoon due to previous health and safety concerns we operate a different system from the morning for the collection of children.

Children have to be collected from the back playground by an adult. This means that car users must park safely in the turning circle, get out of vehicle and come and collect child from staff in the playground.

Please do not;

- Park in Bankton Lane
- Park in clearly marked yellow boxes or marked do not park.

Leave engines running/idling.

Please do;

- Make use of the entire turning circle,
- Park carefully and sensibly
- Collect own child from playground (Upper)
- Supervise walking along path and entry to own vehicle.
- Follow the Highway Code.
- Reduce speed when entering and leaving the car park (20 mph)
- Be courteous and considerate to other road users

Even at this early point in the term we have received a number of complaints from local residents and other parents who have been unable to get up and down Bankton Lane safely due to parents parking in the lane at the end of the day and using this as a pick-up point. This impedes the smooth flow of traffic and does not support a safe and manageable pick up system. Please use the turning circle as outlined above or alternatively make arrangements to collect children from playground/walking line at the end of the day.

Please be aware that Police Scotland support the school in enforcing appropriate road safety is followed in school car parks and surrounding areas. Police Scotland may drop by in the mornings or end of day to assist and provide advice on an individual basis to car drivers.. At Williamston PS, we also promote and encourage children and families to where possible walk, cycle or scoot to school as this provides many benefits for a healthy lifestyle.



<u>Disabled spaces</u> – At Williamston Primary school we have two disabled bays for the use of car users who are eligible to use these spaces and have clearly displayed a 'Blue Badge'. This session we have had on more than one occasion complaints from disabled badge holders that unauthorised cars have been parking in the bays without a Blue Badge clearly displayed. Please do not park in the Disabled bays unless you have a Blue Badge and entitlement to be parking in the disabled spaces. Please be aware that we have contacted Community Police with a request to support the

enforcement of this over the next few weeks and we appreciate this support.

Thank you for your continued support with this matter. All the support we can get from parents to use the turning circle and car line arrangements is appreciated as it ensures that our children are collected safely from school at the end of the day.



Vehicle Emissions- Reminder

We are regularly visited by the **Vehicle Emissions Partnership** who are responsible for monitoring the air pollution of council properties where there are a large number of car users. We wish to remind our parents of the advice that parents/carers switch off car engines when dropping off in the morning and waiting on children coming out of school at the end of the day. This advice

also applies to waiting in the car line in Bankton lane. The reduction of emissions leads to a cleaner environment for all our community users and in particular our nursery children who enjoy using the garden which backs onto the car park area.



Pupil Safety at the end of the day.

We work together with parents to ensure that our pupils are safe in their journey to and from school. We support this in a number of ways;

FMA staff to supervise the school bus exiting and entering the school car park.

PSW staff supervising the children exiting and alighting the school bus.

Breakfast club provision from 8.00am.

PSW support staff in the playground from 8.30am to supervise the children in the playground on arrival at school.

PSW and teacher supervision for dismissal at end of the day from walking line and car line.

WALKING LINE

Courtyard playground P1-P3 children are dismissed by class or stage teacher to a known adult.

Bankton Lane P4-P7 children are escorted by class teacher to top of path where it meets Bankton Lane and dismissed by a member of staff.

P4 and above should only be met in the Courtyard playground if also meeting a younger sibling -this allows us

Simply Play collection for Murieston Simply Play is from school at end of the day.

Parents can help us with managing the variations available for children going home in the following ways;

Where possible be very clear with your child in the morning what the plan is for the end of the day – Walking line, car line, and Simply Play etc.

Provide a written communication for the child/teacher in home learning jotter or school bag if necessary.

If you have decided your child P4-P7 is responsible enough to be allowed to walk home independently, please discuss with your child what to do if when they get home an expected adult is not at home. We advise that the child should return to school where an adult will help them.

Notifying the school of changes to arrangements for end of day.

Unfortunately, we experience a high volume of changes to end of day pick-ups particularly from **walking line** to **car line** and whilst we would do our best to pass this on at times this cannot be guaranteed due to the large number of these messages in the last 45 mins of the day.

We ask for the following support with these changes

Where possible do not change from agreed way home – walking or car line. .

If changing to car – please consider parking elsewhere in surrounding area that would allow you to walk to the school and meet your child as agreed.

We will of course prioritise emergency and unexpected situations. We will also work closely with 'Simply play' to minimise misunderstandings and miscommunication around end of day destinations for our children and parents who use this service.



Parent Helpers

We are very grateful to all parents, grandparents and friends of the school who give their time to support the work and life of the school. We are always looking for parent helpers who are willing to support the school. As a school we have a particular need for parent helpers who are willing to accompany classes on trips both locally and further afield. This session we continue to look for parents who would willing to frequently help out in the library and any parents willing to help out in improving the school grounds with weeding and planting etc. Class teachers are also grateful for any help with regular support in classrooms and with after school clubs. If you are able/willing/keen to help in anyway, please let us know and we will arrange for you to PVG (Protecting Vulnerable Groups) checked with West Lothian Council. Please contact Mrs Dare via the school office who will help you with this process.

Outdoor Learning and play



At Williamston Primary school we promote and encourage outdoor learning and play throughout the year and in all weathers. The benefits of outdoor learning and play are all known to have a farreaching positive impact on children's growth and development. We are asking for support for children from parents by ensuring children are dressed for the weather appropriately. In order to access the open field area in all weathers that children are provided with an outdoor kit if possible including waterproof jacket, old trousers and alternative outdoor shoes (wellies or trainers) . Please ensure all items of clothing are labelled clearly with name of the child and his/her class.

Communication



We share information with parents/carers in a variety of ways, including hard copy letters, Group call text and Group call mail. Group call mail enables us to e-mail information and is therefore an efficient and cost-effective method of communication. All schools in West Lothian continue to have guidance that requires that photocopying and printing costs must be reduced, and each school has had a target imposed. We therefore ask you to regularly check your e-mail to ensure that you do not miss any

communication from us, as Group call mail will be our preferred method of communication. There will obviously be times when hard copy letters will be necessary and of course we will continue to provide those for parents/carers who do not have access to e-mail. Please ensure that the school office has an email contact for your child.

All teachers and classes continue to share learning using the school blog and on the school Twitter account, with teachers and children posting updates on learning and topics through sharing photos and descriptions of the children's experiences for parents and visitors to enjoy.

Please be reminded to contact school as soon as possible if your child is going to be absent from school. The school answer machine is available for parents to leave messages during unmanned hours and we encourage you to use this facility when possible. This practice needs to be repeated each day that your child is absent We also ask that for any absence that school is notified by **9.30am** at the latest. We will follow up any unreported absence and should we fail to be able to contact parents/carers, information will be passed to

appropriate services as part of West Lothian council Safe arrival policy, who will then pursue the reasons for absence.

Keeping ourselves Healthy

We continue to encourage the children to be more responsible for their health. Part of our Health and Wellbeing programme teaches children to maintain good hygiene practice in order to prevent the spreading of germs. These include blowing noses, covering our mouths when coughing and washing hands regularly. We would welcome your continued support to encourage your child to follow this healthy routine.

Late Arrival to School



We continue to encourage children to arrive at school on time every day. The doors to their classrooms are opened at 8:45am which allows them to get into class, organise themselves and be ready to begin their day when the bell rings at 8:50am. The gates at the steps next to the new hall will be closed when the bell rings.

Should your child be late for any reason, please take them to the school office where office staff will make sure they get to their class. We ask you not to open the gates and enter the playground to bring your child to their class. Thank you for your support with these arrangements.

Complaints procedure

If you have any concerns, comments or suggestions about Williamston primary school we are always happy to hear them. Please do not hesitate to contact us and we will either arrange to meet with you face to face or respond to you by telephone call or email.

If following any communication with ourselves, you are unsatisfied with our response we would direct you the complaint procedures for West Lothian Council.


